- 1. This should be a legislative change, if at all.
  - a. Beyond authority because Medical Service Board authority is to draft rules to COMPLY with statutes. This rule is to CHANGE a statute.
  - b. This is a MAJOR change to existing law for the past 25 years. (See CRS 24-4-103 (1.5))
- 2. 65 and Older and we ARE in compliance with Fed Law.
  - a. We have not and will not lose Federal Matching dollars.
  - b. Need to analyze. (2009 CMS Letter, Federal Law, CO Statute and Regulation, Court Decisions)
- 3. Charitable Fund in federal law and state statute it is allowed.
  - a. This change in regulation would make the regulation more restrictive than CO Statute
  - b. Federal Law clearly allows for 100% retention
  - c. CFPD has kept full remainder for 25 years and is spending it locally to benefit people with disabilities.
- 4. In opposition to the Master Trust Document and breach of fiduciary duty.
  - a. Master Trust was approved February 13, 1994. It was approved by Colorado Medicaid at that time and each time it has been amended in 2000, 2008, 2010 and most recently in 2011.
  - b. Master Trust Document and changes create problem with Uniform Trust Code.
- 5. A reduction in amounts retained by the pooled trust results in a dramatic impact to programs the state does not provide. Please focus on REAL LIFE examples!
  - a. Rep Payee

  - c. Impact on Adult Protective Services; Police; Courts; Aging Families; Medicaid Service Providers; Professional Guardians and Conservators; Advocacy Organizations such as the Arcs, BIAC.
